FRUIT TREES

2022 Apple Varieties Shared Characteristics: All apple varieties listed below for the Spring Tree Sale share some common characteristics. Apple trees will reach a height of 12-15' and will spread approximately 12-15' wide. Each has a white bloom and has Medium—large fruit size. **Pollination is required (you will need to buy two varieties or plant near an existing apple tree of a different variety for cross pollination)** and the trees require full sun. Loamy, well drained soils will yield highest success with a pH Level between 6.0 and 7.0. It will take approximately 2-7 years for the trees to begin bearing fruit.

APPLE TREE DESCRIPTIONS:

Honeycrisp (STD, 9/16" diameter) Outstanding fresh-eating qualities make this variety a favorite. Fruit is aromatic and sweet with a juicy, crisp texture. Calcium improves fruit quality and helps with growth. Pollination required.

State Fair (SM-7, 7/16" diameter) Medium size fruit, brilliantly striped with reddish orange over a blushing yellow background. Fruit is creamy flesh is firm, juicy, aromatic and sweet and firmer than most early varieties. Short storage life of 2-4 weeks. Ripens in late August and September. Pollination Required.

Wolf River (STD 9/16" diameter) An old variety, hardy and long lived. Best known for its large size - up to 5" diameter fruit. Color is pale yellow to green with carmine-red blushes and stripes. Primarily used as a cooking apple. Ripens in October. Pollination required.

Ginger Gold (EMLA 111, 3/4 diameter) A sweet, soft fleshed apple with a pale yellow coloring and a creamy colored flesh. Fruit is mild sweet and enjoyed raw and cooked. It is one of the best early-ripening apple varieties enjoyed all over the country. Ripening mid to late summer. Has a long shelf life of up to 1-2 months. Pollination required.

PEACH TREE DESCRIPTION:

Reliance (Peach) A heavy crop of medium sized, freestone, red blushed yellow fruits in mid-late summer. A vigorous and fast-growing peach tree with a sweet flesh. Noted for its hardiness and is perfect for eating, baking and canning. It is self-pollinating,

CONIFEROUS TREE SEEDLINGS

Cedar, White (*Thuja occidentalis*) Small to medium-sized tree growing up to 60 ft. Very slow-growing. Shade tolerant but best in full or partial sun. Prefers moist deep rich organic soil, but will inhabit dry upland sites. Not found in upland acidic soils. Adapted to clay and sand soils. Wood commercially valuable due to its variety of uses. Favorite deer shelter and food. Native.

Pine, Red (*Pinus resinosa*) Fast-growing, long-lived tree growing up to 80 feet. Shade-intolerant. Grows best on well-drained sandy loam soil. Intolerant of high water tables. Excellent tree for reforestation on poor sandy sites. Timber tree with distinctive reddish bark. Native.

Pine, White (*Pinus strobus*) Long-lived, moderately fast-growing reaching 80-100 feet. Fairly shade-tolerant, seedlings grow best in partial shade. Prefers moist sandy loam soils but will grow on a variety of sites from swamp to dry sand.

Birch, White (*Betula papyrifera*) Fast growing, medium to large tree size reaching 60-131 feet. Grows best where it can remain cool and moist but also receive full sun on its foliage.

Pine, Jack (*Pinus banksiana*) Small to medium sized tree reaching 55-65 feet. Great habitat for unique wildlife species including endangered Kirtland's warbler and excels in dry, acidic sandy soils or in loamy or thin soils over bedrock. Native.

Cedar, Red (*Juniperus virginiana*) Small to medium sized reaching 10-40 feet. Occurs commonly on limestone derived soils. Does best on dry soils in full sun light. Native.

Spruce, Blue (*Picea pungens*) A native of the Rocky Mountains, slow-growing, long-lived, medium-sized up to 50 feet. Grows well on almost any upland soil; drought resistant. Root system very shallow on heavy textured or wet soils, exposed trees subject to wind throw. Exotic.

Spruce, Norway (*Picea abies*) Moderately fast-growing, long-lived tree reaching 85 feet. Prefers full sun, tolerates some shade. Thrives on rich, acid, moist well-drained soils but will grow on wide variety. Root system shallow on clay or poorly-drained soils.

Spruce, White (*Picea glauca*) Medium to large reaching 80 feet. Shade-tolerant but prefers sun. Clay, sand and loam soils with moisture conditions from moist to dry, best in well-drained sandy loams. Drought resistant. Straight stemmed, narrow crowned. Native.

2022 PLUG STOCK

Plug Stock Seeded in trays, when the plug is extracted, soil is left on the roots for protection during handling and planting. Plug stock tend to have a higher survival rate than bare root stock.

2022 Plug stock available: (size 6-12") Red Oak, Red Pine, Jack Pine, White Pine, Balsam Fir, Norway Spruce, Tamarack, White Birch and White Cedar.

DECIDUOUS TREES AND SHRUBS

Pee Gee Hydrangea (*Hydrangea paniculate*) Large, sometimes giant white flower heads reaching 6 to 18 inches long can turn pinkish with age. In the right conditions. Fast-growing shrub that can reach 25 feet tall. One of the most cold-hardy species. It may be grown as a single-stemmed tree specimen or as a multi-stemmed shrub.

Wild Grape (*Vitis riparia*) Wild grape is a high climbing, woody vine that grows up to 60' to 100 long in it's natural setting. Fast growth rate. Will grow well in shady areas, but for maximum fruit yields, prefers sun. Wild grape is quite hardy, though intermittent frosts can reduce fruit yields. Great wildlife species. Native.

Trumpet Vine (*Campsis radicans*) A native North American ornamental vine. Orange flowers from mid to late summer. Very attractive species for butterflies and hummingbirds. Can be a very aggressive grower, suckering up from the root system when trimmed down. Native.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*) Moderately fast-growing large tree that thrives on rich moist soils but also grows on sandy sites. Long-lived, it reaches heights of 70 feet and does best in full sun or light shade. Desirable street and lawn tree as it is tolerant of salt. Acorns taken by grouse, squirrels, deer and other wildlife. Native.

White Oak (*Quercus alba*) Slow-growing large tree that reaches 90 feet. Tolerates most soils except very wet sites. Acorns a favorite of both birds and animals. Valuable timber/wildlife tree. Native.

American Mt. Ash (*Sorbus aucuparia*) Fast-growing to 40 feet. Beautiful white spring flowers. Bright reddish-orange berries in fall attract wildlife. Grows best in rich moist soils of river banks and swamp borders and in rocky forest areas. Host for Swallowtail butterflies. Exotic.

DECIDUOUS TREES AND SHRUBS

Lilac, Common (*Syringa vulgaris*) The common lilac is an old-fashioned, long-lived, and well-loved lilac best known for its fragrant flowers. It is extremely hardy and thrives with little care which make it a lovely shrub for a specimen planting, in masses, screens, hedges, or mixed in shrub borders. The May blooming flowers are typically purple to lilac. Exotic

Walnut, Black (*Juglans nigra*) Quick growing tree in ideal conditions up to 70-100 ft. Self pollinating. Great wildlife tree for all types of animals. Roots produce toxin not suitable for sensitive species of plants.

Hazelnut, American (*Corylus americana*) American hazelnut is a small tree with an edible nut. It is a medium to fast growing species, that suckers moderately, eventually producing a multi-stemmed, clump appearance. American Hazelnut grows as a strong multi-stemmed shrub, with their edible nuts maturing in September-October. It is planted by wildlife enthusiasts to attract and keep game in an area. The nuts produced by American hazelnut are a mast of squirrels, deer, turkey, woodpeckers, pheasants and other animals. The male catkins are a food staple of ruffed grouse throughout the winter. Native

Winterberry, Holly (*Ilex verticillate*) Winterberry (*Ilex verticillata*), also known as Michigan Holly, is primarily a wetland shrub. It can reach up to 12 feet in height. It prefers wet to moist soil with very poor to moderate drainage. It is salt sensitive. Winterberry transplants well and is fairly resistant to disease and insects. It is also resistant to compact soils. The berries have a high wildlife value for waterfowl and songbirds, but are poisonous to humans. Winterberry needs both male and female plants for berries. Native

Plum, American (*Prunus americana*) American Plum has white flowers in spring. The roots are shallow, widely spread, and send up suckers. Development of suckers from the root system makes American plum effective in stabilizing stream banks and gullies. It will tolerate several days of flooding. The branches are thorny. The fruits are about 1 inch in diameter. The American plum is used for both ornamental and culinary purposes. The sour and sweet fruit is eaten fresh and is made into jellies, jam and wine. Native

Hydrangea, Blue (*Hydrangea Macrophylla*) Known for its splendid blue flower clusters when grown in acidic soils the Hydrangea makes a great edging. When planted in alkaline soils the flower color may have some pink hues. Growing best in semi-shaded areas it can reach 4 to 6 feet tall and wide very quickly. Needs to be watered regularly to maintain evenly moist soils— weekly.

Highbush Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*) Attractive shrub up to 15 feet that will tolerate a high degree of shade once established. Tolerates a broad range of soils, including wet clay. Prefers moist site in the open or partial shade. Produces handsome clusters of white flowers. Bright scarlet berries are winter food for ruffed grouse. Native.

Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*) Shade intolerant, spreading shrub up to 10 feet. Pink to white flowers appear in June & July. Fruit attracts wildlife, remains on branches throughout winter. Along stream banks, the branches provide high quality aquatic cover. Great for borders and screens, transplants easily. Native.

Maple, Red (*Acer rubum*) Fast-growing and moderately long-lived tree reaching heights of 70 ft. Shade tolerant. Found in all sorts of woods, prefers wet to moist poorly-drained sandy or loam soil. Well named tree as the flowers, young fruit and autumn foliage are a brilliant red. Often planted as a shade tree. Native.

Maple, Sugar (*Acer saccharum*) Hard maple. Valued for its wood and also as a shade and ornamental tree. Sap is a source for maple sugar. Grows best on rich moist upland soils but will adapt to poorer, drier sites. Slow-growing and long-lived. Reaches heights of 90 feet. Native.

Serviceberry (*Amelanchier arborea*) Also known as Juneberry, 15-25 feet. White flowers appear before leaves. Young leaves are covered with soft, woolly hairs that disappear as leaf matures. Small, edible berries are reddish purple and the leaves may turn wine-red in fall. Prefers moist, well-drained, acid soils and is shade tolerant. Native.

Elderberry, Ranch (*Sambucus canadensis*) Is very forgiving if you have non-fertile soils and grows 5-6 feet tall which makes it great for picking berries. The Ranch Elderberry is able to handle a zone 3 winter easily but does **requires cross pollination**. The Wyldewood Elderberry is a great option.

Elderberry, Wyldewood (*Sambucus canadensis*) Known for its high fruit yield, the Wyldewood Elderberry is a great shrub to have. It is a well known ingredient in wine and jams but it is also used to help mitigate colds and flues because of its antiviral properties and a great source of vitamin C. It likes partial sun and well drained soil and **requires cross pollination**. The Ranch Elderberry is a great choice for cross pollination.

DECIDUOUS TREES AND SHRUBS

Dogwood, Red Osier (*Cornus sericea*) Multi-stemmed spreading shrub up to 9 feet. Dark green foliage turns purple in the fall. Twigs turn red in winter. Thrives in wet soils. White flowers in June provide berries in fall. Wildlife food and habitat. Native.

Eastern Redbud (*Cercis Canadensis* L.) Beautiful tree reaching 15-30 feet tall and spreading 15-25 feet. Deer enjoy browsing twigs during spring and summer and its flowers provide nectar for hummingbirds and pollen for honeybees. Other wildlife also take advantage of the buds, bark, and seed. Native.

Crabapple, Siberian (*Malus Baccata*) A very hardy tree that adapts to a variety of soils but prefers a heavy loam soil. Like its name Siberian it tolerates a zone 2 well. Grows best in full sun, well drained and moist soils. Great wildlife tree.

Butterfly Bush (*Buddleja davidii*) Beautiful, fast growing deciduous shrub with masses of blossoms that bloom from summer to autumn. Producing flowers that vary in shades of purple. Also known as summer lilacs, butterfly bushes are hardy to zone 4 and a low maintenance shrub. It prefers full sun and fertile, well drained soils.

Tamarack (*Larix laricina*) Medium-sized deciduous conifers tree that tolerates extremely varied climatic conditions, regions of varying rainfall and a variety of soils. Known to grow best in moist, well drained loamy soils with organic content. Reaches 30-60 feet.

Staghorn Sumac (*Rhus typhina*) The stag-horn sumac is a 15-30 ft., colony-forming, deciduous shrub with crooked, leaning trunks, picturesque branches and velvety twigs. Large, bright-green, pinnately-compound leaves become extremely colorful in early fall. On female plants, yellow-green flowers are followed by fuzzy, bright red berries in erect, pyramidal clusters which persist throughout winter. Staghorn Sumac reaches tree size more often than related species and commonly forms thickets. In winter, the bare, widely forking, stout, hairy twigs resemble deer antlers in velvet, hence the alternate common name.

Blueberry, Patriot (*Vaccinium corymbosum*) Patriot blueberry is a early-season variety that is highly productive, with large, juicy-sweet berries. The plant grows compact, spreading somewhat, is a great addition to any landscape.

Raspberry, Nova (*Rubus idaeus var.*) Nova was released from the Nova Scotia breeding program in 1981 and is still one of the highest quality raspberries you can grow. Adaptable to all climates and can be used as a summer-bearer in the far north—Grow as a fall-bearer in the deep south! For areas in between Nova produces 2 crops of large, attractive, firm berries with excellent flavor. Zones 3-8.

Choke Cherry (*Prunus virginiana* L.) A large, deciduous shrub or small understory tree, choke cherry grows 20-30 ft. tall and often forms thickets. Dense clusters of white flowers are followed by red fruit ripening to dark purple from August to September. Berries can be made into jellies. Native
